Innovation develops the personal health care work force

The region is home to more than 4,500 health care companies that employ more than 195,000 people. The region is ranked 14th in the nation for health care jobs with Phoenix leading the way as the top-ranked city. The region ranks second in availability of a skilled health care workforce. In Arizona, hospitals alone employ more than 80,000 people and contribute \$11.5 billion to the gross state product.

The Greater Phoenix region boasts internationally prominent research and treatment facilities, including Banner M.D. Anderson Cancer Center, Barrow Neurological Institute, Cancer Treatment Centers of America, Mayo Clinic, Phoenix Children's Hospital and Translational Genomics Research Institute (TGen). Fourteen of the region's hospitals are ranked with high-performing specialties and of these, four have one or more nationally ranked specialties.

Innovative collaborations, such as the one between Arizona State University and Mayo Clinic, are advancing personalized medicine and health care delivery for the region and will continue to have a vital impact on the region's economy.

Creating a Healthy Economy

The Phoenix Health Care Sector Partnership (PHCSP) is a collaborative of health care leaders, educational institutions and community partners dedicated to improving health outcomes for the community, strengthening the health system and fostering expansions of health care companies that generate quality job opportunities for the region's residents.

Engagement by participants in the Phoenix Health Care Sector Partnership's initiatives has more than doubled since the City of Phoenix launched the effort in July 2013 and has since come under the aegis of the **Phoenix Forward** Health Care Leadership Council. PHCSP has grown to more than 300 industry and community leaders committed to advancing its priorities: **enhance the talent pipeline and promote the region as a wellness destination.**

Phoenix health care sector priorities

Enhance the talent pipeline: By pinpointing specific workforce needs, identifying changes necessary in workforce training and developing strategies to produce needed health care workers, high-wage jobs will be produced to strengthen the health care system.

Strategies

- Data: Identify current and future workforce needs
- Address talent pipeline issues for high-priority occupations, specifically in nursing and behavioral health professions
- Expand graduate medical education opportunities
- Maximize federal funding for loan repayment program

Accomplishments

- Expand loan repayment program to cover critical occupations
- Medical Licensure Compact: recognizes licenses of medical professionals from participating states

Promote the region as a wellness destination: The *Wellness AtoZ* initiative promotes the region's healthy, active lifestyle and high quality of life in order to attract and retain top talent. *Wellness AtoZ* is a program of the Greater Phoenix Chamber Foundation (GPCF) aimed at helping businesses implement employee wellness programs.
