Valleywise Health: New Hospital

Opening in April 2024, the new [Valleywise Health](#) Medical Center will replace the more than 50-year-old legacy hospital currently operating at 24th Street and Roosevelt in Phoenix.

By the Numbers

- Floors: 10
- Square feet: 673,000
- Anticipated patient volume: 12,898 annually (projected for 2026)
- Private patient rooms: 233
- ICU rooms: 44
- Operating rooms: 10
- Interventional radiology areas: 2
- Catheterization labs: 2
- Helipads: 2
- Pounds of steel in frame: 7,500,000 pounds
- Cubic yards of concrete: 12,169 cubic yards
- Miles of data cables installed (for IT purposes): 1.7 million feet of cable (or 321.97 miles). This is also roughly the distance between Phoenix and Las Vegas!
- Hours of emergency backup power: Unlimited
- Number of fire sprinklers: 6,541 fire sprinkler heads
- Number of windows: 444
- Investment: In 2014, voters approved Prop 480, which provided Valleywise Health \$935 million in bonding authority to transform the Valley's public teaching hospital and safety net system of care.
- More than 500 Valleywise Health staff participated directly in the programming/design process for the new tower.

Trauma and Emergency Department

- Square feet: 34,550
- Trauma bays: 6
- ED treatment rooms: 88, including exam, trauma, triage, fast track, critical treatment, observation, and pediatric observation.
- Anticipated patient volume: 85,906 ER visits annually (projected for 2026)

Diane & Bruce Halle Arizona Burn Center

- Founded: 1965
- Square feet: 72,000 (fourth floor of new medical center), which is nearly triple the size of current burn center and burn emergency department
- Beds: 16 adult intensive care beds; 24 adult acute care beds; 10 pediatric ICU/acute care beds
- Also includes: Dedicated pediatric wing; large physical and occupational therapy room; outpatient center; family support rooms, playroom for children with burn injuries; space for research and teaching

Commitment to Renewability

- Valleywise Health has committed to energy and carbon reductions through renovation and construction of efficient buildings and is seeking to procure renewable power through power purchase agreements.
- Building construction and operational standards have been updated through-out the system with sustainability in mind including LED lighting, efficient air distribution and utilization of high-performance glass.
- Valleywise Health participated in a climate resiliency, adaptation and mitigation screening and planning workshop at the beginning of 2018 and have been implementing many of the recommendations since then.
